

Seated Belaying

Why

Guidance has arisen following a number of examples of people who are chair users not being allowed to carry out belaying in a climbing wall

Many walls have a policy of not being seated when belaying. This is because it may promote bad and unsafe practice.

Chair users are included in this policy.


What do we mean by seated.

• Guidance will cover

People who are wheelchair users including Self Propelled. Assisted propelled and powered chairs

People who may have to sit down due to not being able to stand for long periods of time sufficient to carry out the process of belaying or due to balance difficulties.






What will the guidance cover

- It will cover seated belayers who want to top bottom top rope belay and lead belay.
- It will provide guidance for facilities to assess a persons capability to belay in the above scenarios.

Examples of Content

An important aspect of this guidance is developing a systems that enable a person to access training and demonstrate their ability.

Very often it will be the perceived additional risks associated with a disabled person that will prevent any avenues being explored.

- An exciting part of the this guidance has been the evolution of different belaying systems for example

- Geometry assisted braking devices

- Meeting with Mountain Training


